

Some thoughts.....

You'll need to make this issue last 3 weeks – read slowly! For the next couple of weeks we hope to be worshipping at Hawkshead Hill Baptist Church in the Lake District – which is even smaller numerically than our own BBC. It's an old church, much older than Broxburn BC – dates back to the late 1600s. It's quaint, with an outside baptismal tank which looks more

like a cattle trough. It is well looked after and the small sanctuary area is light and modern. They sing old and new



hymns and songs and use modern technology. We don't really know the folk there and they don't know us. Some are local Cumbrians, others are escapees from less picturesque parts of England. Don't think



there are any Scots but then we are in a different country so maybe that's not surprising. The service is quite similar to ours but the layout of the seats doesn't leave you anywhere to hide. They have tea and biscuits after the service – but no banana loaf...might be different this year. I like worshipping at the local church when we're on holiday – it need not be a Baptist church, in fact in Cornwall we once tried the local Baptist church but the worship was a bit more charismatic than I was comfortable with so we went back to the Methodist/United Reformed Church we had normally gone to where we have got to know some of the folk and they recognise us – haven't been since before lockdown, wonder if it's still the same? If you get away this summer, go to the local church. It might not be Baptist, it might not use the same form of worship, it might even be in a foreign language but the God you worship is the same wherever you are. He doesn't just speak English and he can handle the charismatic and the formal worship better then we can. Come back refreshed. If you're not getting away relax knowing that God doesn't take holidays – he's never away! The Chadian population continues facing severe economic, social, political, educational, health and human development problems. Please pray that the consistent health work performed by our partners at Guinebor II Hospital in capital N'Djamena and Bardaï hospital will continue harvesting positive results.



SUNDAY 2

The recruitment of professional health and administrative staff is key for both Guinebor II and Bardaï hospitals. Please pray that the required staff will be recruited to partner organisations in Chad.

MONDAY 3

Good governance and implementation of transparent processes are essential for hospitals. Pray for Guinebor II Hospital's Board of Trustees, for God to continue equipping them with vision and compassion.

TUESDAY 4

Praise God for the new building and services offered at the physiotherapy unit at Guinebor II. Pray that the unit will become a place to meet with God, relax and establish friendships. WEDNESDAY 5

Please pray for BMS World Mission workers Mark and Andrea Hotchkin and their work in Bardaï. Pray that God will continue equipping them with resources to train medical staff. THURSDAY 6

The installation of solar panels and access to clean water systems will allow for the sustainable daily running of Bardaï Hospital. Please pray for the provision of the necessary financial resources.

FRIDAY 7

Please pray for the physical and spiritual safety of BMS staff and their partners at the hospitals in Chad. Pray that God's presence will be visible to them day by day.

SATURDAY 8

Please pray for a general election in Chad. This has been postponed many times due to a climate of instability. Pray that God will use those who know his name to speak out and to bring justice.

Two-and-a-half years since the closure of North Korea's borders, news from the country is still sparse and often negative. There is a possibility that China-Korea borders could open in 2023: we pray that this will herald the opening of people's hearts to the gospel, despite the risk of severe hardship for those who believe.



SUNDAY 9

There is little new information about Coronavirus in the country. Please pray for the health of the people, that the virus does not spread, and for nurses and other healthcare workers in North Korea.

MONDAY 10

"Your Majesty, you are the king of kings. The God of heaven has given you dominion and power and might and glory" (Daniel 2: 37). Please pray that believers in the North would remember that God is over all rulers.

TUESDAY 11

North Korea is prone to typhoons and flooding around this time of year. Please pray for this year's crops to grow well, and that there would be sufficient food for all.

WEDNESDAY 12

Please pray for foreign professors who teach remotely at academic institutions in North Korea. Pray for their return to the country as soon as possible.

THURSDAY 13

Severe punishment is meted out to North Koreans who watch TV from the South, as it shows how well developed their southern neighbour is. Pray that North Koreans will see ethical programmes that point them to God.

FRIDAY 14

An estimated six to seven million North Koreans use mobile phones, for which only statemonitored intranet is permitted. Please pray that God would somehow use this technology for good.

SATURDAY 15

Please pray that technological access to the outside world would prompt a change of heart among the people of North Korea. Pray they would "humble themselves and pray and seek [his] face" (2 Chronicles 7: 14).

In the global population, disability is as common as blue eyes. However, in many contexts in which BMS works, disability is considered a punishment. Disability is accompanied by stigma, and little accommodation is made to support those living with disability or their families. Please pray as BMS World Mission seeks to model a different worldview.



SUNDAY 16

Pray for BMS' work globally in the area of the safeguarding of people at risk. Pray especially for Lou Lynch in Bangladesh, who works with an array of partners in the region. Lou helps them think through the policy and practice of protection for those at risk, including those living with disability.

MONDAY 17

Pray for BMS-supported workers in northern Uganda who are assisting young people in the Faith, Audiology and Speech Therapy project, aiming to create opportunity and inclusion in a context where disability is frequently misunderstood.

TUESDAY 18

Give thanks for Judy Cook's work with children with severe disability at Hope Home in Thailand. Pray for patience, love and grace as she provides care.

WEDNESDAY 19

Conflict creates brokenness. Pray for BMS-supported work providing mental health services for those living with psychological trauma in Afghanistan.

THURSDAY 20

Please pray for Bethan Shrubsole as she finishes work at Guinebor II Hospital in Chad. Bethan has pioneered physiotherapy for children living with severe learning difficulties and an array of disabilities.

FRIDAY 21

Pray that the work established by Bethan will change negative social attitudes to people with disabilities throughout Chad, as well as improving healthcare practices for them.

SATURDAY 22

Pray for Mark and Andrea Hotchkin in Bardaï in northern Chad. Pray their surgery on those scarred by traumatic violence and accidents would be successful.

Algeria

A longside Algeria's 98% Muslim majority live an estimated 90,000 Christians, mainly converts from Islam and their children. Many Algerian converts are Berbers, indigenous to North Africa, but an ethnic minority in this Arab-majority country. It is not illegal to convert from Islam, but anyone proselytising Muslims risks a five-year prison sentence.

Islam is the declared state religion but the constitution guarantees freedom "to exercise worship", if exercised in accordance with the law. However, other laws reduce the effectiveness of this guarantee for non-Muslims. Although, according to a 2006 ordinance, the National Commission for Non-Muslim Worship can grant permits for churches, so far none have been issued, despite repeated requests by churches.

Building safety committees have inspected many church buildings since November 2017. Part of their remit is to determine which churches qualify for permits under the 2006 ordinance. More than 20 churches have been ordered to close since the beginning of 2018, but only three are known to have been granted permission to reopen.

Aouchiche church in the port city of Béjaïa was issued an administrative closure order in April 2022. It was instructed to stop worship meetings, despite the 300-strong congregation being a member of the EPA (Église Protestante d'Algérie), the officially <u>https://www.barnabasaid.org/gb/</u> recognised group of Protestant churches in Algeria. In November 2021, the Algerian government summoned Pastor Salah Chalah, the president of the EPA, to court for practising non-Muslim rites without permission.

In February 2022 local officials started legal proceedings against leaders of another EPA church in Ait Atteli in the province of Tizi Ouzou, with the aim of closing the church. The provincial governor took this action against the pastor and his father, who owns the land where the church building stands. The province of Tizi Ouzou has the highest concentration of Christians in the country.



Algeria's Christians have faced the closure of 17 churches in the past five years

Cry out to the Lord that the closure of churches on spurious administrative grounds will be halted. Pray that the authorities will issue permits for church buildings and that churches ordered to close will be reopened.



Tying knots is something else you'll need to be able to do if you want to survive.



CLOVE HITCH




