





BMS Prayer Guide 2023

Every year Greece welcomes thousands of visitors: history buffs touring ancient sites; food lovers visiting olive groves; Bible scholars in the footsteps of Paul; tourists seeking sunshine; and people on the move searching for safety and security. This last group led BMS World Mission to Lesbos two years ago.



SUNDAY 23

Greece and Cyprus have had to bear an inequitable share of bearing up the lives of those fleeing their home countries. Pray that BMS and All4Aid will help advocate to make Greece and Cyprus fairer places for people on the move and to keep their plight high on the agenda of European nations.

MONDAY 24

Our partner has recently expanded to other countries and appointed a finance director. Praise God for the new financial systems that have been set up and pray that the director will have co-operative officials in all countries of operation.

TUESDAY 25

Give thanks for the safe space for women and girls that BMS partner All4Aid provides on Lesbos. Pray that as well as being able to shower, wash clothes, pick up essential items and chat, the centre users would experience a deep sense of God's love.

WEDNESDAY 26

Pray that those who come to choose items at the food banks run by our partner will also take time to stop and chat and find out more about the faith of those who run the programmes.

THURSDAY 27

BMS started to work with All4aid in Cyprus this year. Pray that people on the move who come to the centre will encounter Christ as well as practical assistance.

FRIDAY 28

Give thanks for the good reputation that our partner has and the respect that its staff have among the volunteer community. Pray that people will see that the difference is Christ in them.

SATURDAY 29

July

Please pray for BMS-supported worker Rodrigo, leader of BMS' partner organisation. Pray that as he carries out speaking engagements he will increase awareness of the needs of people on the move.

What does God look like?



What does God look like?

Is he an old man with long flowing grey hair and beard? Is he an amorphous cloud. Does he sit on clouds?

There have been many different ideas over the centuries of what God looks like but that's all they are – ideas. No one knows what God looks like. In fact, the bible expressly forbids people making representations of God because to do so would reduce God to simply one of us or encourage us to worship the image rather than God himself.

I have no idea what God looks like. I know what he is like, what his characteristics are – the Bible tells us that he is loving and just and merciful and all powerful and everything else we read of him – but nowhere, as far as I am aware does it tell us what he looks like. Is that surprising? No, it's not. Given that we are mere earthbound mortals limited to time and space and our own finite experiences we could never understand the immortal. We will need to wait until we meet him face to face and then we will know and understand.

But in the meantime, God has been good to us because he displays himself in forms that we **can** understand and he did that supremely when he sent his son. In Colossians 1 v 15 Paul writes – and he's talking about Jesus - 'He is the image of the invisible God'.

So when we see Jesus that is the best picture of what God is like. Not in bodily form but in personality and character. Again in Hebrews 1v3 we read 'The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being.' God sent Jesus in a human form — a form that we can understand with body and head and legs and everything else just like us and we are grateful that he did.


In the bible there are other different occasions recorded when God appears in a similar manner but not in completeness.

In Exodus 33 Moses has an encounter with God....

- ¹⁸ Then Moses said, Now show me your glory.
- ¹⁹ And the LORD said, I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the LORD, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.
 - ²⁰ But, he said, you cannot see my **face**, for no-one may see me and live.

But there are occasions in the bible when God works in a visible form by using his hands. It has been said that God has no hands apart from you and I but that's not strictly true and I want, over the next 3 issues, to look at three occasions in the bible where God works and does so using hands.

If you want a title for these future thoughts, it could be 'The Finger of God.'
