


The Finger of God 1.

Last week I wrote..... I want, over the next 3 issues, to look at three occasions in the bible where God works and does so using hands. So this is the first.....

Exodus 31 v 12-18

12 Then the LORD said to Moses,

¹³ Say to the Israelites, 'You must observe my Sabbaths. This will be a sign between me and you for the generations to come, so that you may know that I am the LORD, who makes you holy.



¹⁴ 'Observe the Sabbath, because it is holy to you. Anyone who desecrates it must be put to death; whoever does any work on that day must be cut off from his people.

¹⁵ For six days, work is to be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of rest, holy to the LORD. Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day must be put to death.


¹⁶ The Israelites are to observe the Sabbath, celebrating it for the generations to come as a lasting covenant.

¹⁷ It will be a sign between me and the Israelites for ever, for in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, and on the seventh day he abstained from work and rested.'

¹⁸ When the LORD finished speaking to Moses on Mount Sinai, he gave him the two tablets of the Testimony, **the tablets of stone inscribed by the finger of God.**

At this point in the history of God's people they had gone through the transition from being a small nomadic family grouping to being a nation large enough not be ignored. It hadn't been easy, it had taken many years oppressed in Egypt but now they were on their way to the Promised Land under the leadership of Moses. And on the way God was working on them and with them and in the passage above God was giving them clear instructions as to what was and was not acceptable to him. 2 months after escaping from Egypt the people arrived in the desert area of Mount Sinai. In chapter 19 v 1 Moses goes up the mountain to meet with God and as part of that visit he receives the 10 commandments. In chapter 24 v 18 we read that he goes up into the mountain again to meet with God ¹⁸ Then Moses entered the cloud as he went on up the mountain. And he stayed on the mountain forty days and forty nights.' In chapters 25 to 31 we can read more of God's instructions and with this guidance in place there could be no claiming that they didn't know how they should behave. And God gave them his detailed instructions written on 'tablets of stone inscribed by the finger of God.' If you like this was the Finger of the Law – this is how you should behave, this is what God expects of his people. The law – knowing what is right and pleases God and what is wrong and brings his displeasure.

But the problem with the law was that no one could keep it in every detail. No one could save themselves from the wrath of God.
