

BMS World Mission has been involved in Tunisia since the 1990s. At one point, BMS had 15 adult mission workers placed with our partner. The current team is smaller, but praise God, it is now possible for BMS to support the employment of local Christians – unimaginable when we first s tarted work in North Africa!



SUNDAY 6

The democratic hopes of the Tunisian Revolution in 2011 seem distant as the current President acts independently, leading to political and voter frustration. Pray that the fallibility of politicians and systems will encourage people to be open when they hear witness to the infallibility of God.

MONDAY 7

With the Tunisian economy in crisis, government subsidies on many basic goods ended over the past year. Pray that people who are now struggling to make ends meet will find the sources of help they need.

TUESDAY 8

BMS' partner is working with other groups to establish a network that could meet the needs of a group of refugees who are at risk of exploitation. Pray that this local partnership will bear long-term fruit.

WEDNESDAY 9

BMS mission worker Sophie* travels to the UK for home assignment soon. Pray that she will complete the necessary work before travelling and that her time in the UK will be encouraging.

THURSDAY 10

Lift up BMS-supported workers Hada* and Alia*, working with our partner. Praise God for their passionate witness and their desire to honour him in all that they do. *Names changed for security reasons.

FRIDAY 11

Sophie is on our partner's leadership team. Pray for the team as they lead and resource a growing organisation in a difficult financial environment. May they see God's miraculous provision during turbulent times.

SATURDAY 12

As Tunisia celebrates its National Women's Day tomorrow, thank God for the economic, educational and political rights that Tunisian women have and pray that more women and girls will come to total freedom in Christ.

Where, what and when 19. David anointed King


Where?

In the land God gave to the Israelites.

What?

When Saul died, David's succession was not automatic. Saul's family still had the support of some of the army and people and for a time there was war between the family of Saul and David's supporters. David was recognised as King of Judah (the southern part of the country) first (2 Samuel 2:1-6). While Saul's son, Ish-Bosheth ruled Israel to the north. Gradually however the supporters of David became stronger – 2 Samuel 3 1.

'The war between the house of Saul and the house of David lasted a long time. David grew stronger and stronger, while the house of Saul grew weaker and weaker.'



Seven and a half years after he became king of Judah he was crowned king of Israel so uniting the country again. – 2 Samuel 5:1-5.

David reigned over the whole country for 33 years until he died -1 Kings 2:10-12. David was God's man but he was just a man and prone to get it wrong, sometimes disastrously.

Read a story of David's failure in 2 Samuel 11 and 12

The Finger of God 2.

Bible Reading 2 Daniel 5 v 1-5; 26-31

¹ King Belshazzar gave a great banquet for a thousand of his nobles and drank wine with them. ² While Belshazzar was drinking his wine, he gave orders to bring in the gold and silver goblets that Nebuchadnezzar his father had taken from the temple in Jerusalem, so that the king and his nobles, his wives and his concubines might drink from them. ³ So they brought in the gold goblets that had been taken from the temple of God in Jerusalem, and the king and his nobles, his wives and his concubines drank from them.



⁴ As they drank the wine, they praised the gods of gold and silver, of bronze, iron, wood and stone. ⁵ Suddenly the fingers of a human hand appeared and wrote on the plaster of the wall, near the lampstand in the royal palace. The king watched the hand as it wrote.

²⁶This is what these words mean:

Mene: God has numbered the days of your reign and brought it to an end.

²⁷ Tekel: You have been weighed on the scales and found wanting.


²⁸ Peres: Your kingdom is divided and given to the Medes and Persians.

²⁹Then at Belshazzar's command, Daniel was clothed in purple, a gold chain was placed around his neck, and he was proclaimed the third highest ruler in the kingdom. ³⁰ That very night Belshazzar, king of the Babylonians, was slain, ³¹ and Darius the Mede took over the kingdom, at the age of sixty-two.

Thoughts: 'The Finger of Judgement'

Belshazzar was one of the most powerful men alive at that time but he was not beyond the hand of God and here in this incident we see the Finger of Judgement writing on the wall. Sixty-six years earlier Nebuchadnezzar had sacked Jerusalem and taken away all the furnishings of the temple including the various gold, silver and bronze dishes and utensils. These had been made to God's instructions and dedicated to use in his worship but here Belshazzar used them in his drunken party. Used them not for worship but for merrymaking, not to serve the living God but to toast the gods of gold and silver of bronze, iron, wood and stone. He had complete disregard for God — and there was judgement. In their drunken partying this disembodied hand writing on the wall must have sobered them up very quickly. Words written in Aramaic a language the Babylonians could read and understand but no one could work out what the significance of the words was. That is not until the queen mother reminded them that Daniel the Jew had a gift from God of being able to interpret prophecy. And so Daniel was called and the judgement was pronounced.

Taking God lightly, disobeying God, breaking his laws, living without regard to him means judgement. Judgement, not only for Belshazzar, but for all those who disregard God. The bible states very clearly that the result of sin is death, separation from God for ever. Those who have never sorted things out with God will face the finger of judgement.
