

Just think how nice it would be if someone else cleared the debt that you had accumulated.

Some people think that's how God works – we can go through life ignoring God's laws and instructions, building up a backlog of spiritual

debt and when it comes to the crunch God will simply pay our bill, clear the slate. But that thought is naïve and a distortion of what the Bible teaches. Christ gave his life so that we might know forgiveness, but that forgiveness comes through conversion. We acknowledge that we are sinners, we believe that Jesus died on our behalf, we change the way we think and live and we try to live in line with God's teaching and standards. Does that mean we never sin – no it doesn't – but It means our default position is not to sin but if we do - If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. I John 1:9.

Having difficulties with your finances and credit cards can be a worrying problem but is a problem that is solvable and limited to this life. Having problems with our debt of sin is far more serious and has eternal consequences. Sort it while you can.



Are you amazed by Jesus? -1.

Over the next 2 or 3 issues I want us to ask ourselves a question - Are we amazed by



Jesus? There are several occasions where the word 'amazed' is used by the NIV to describe the reaction of people to the Jesus who walked and talked among them and I want to think about what was it that made these people amazed and what it can say to us today.

Reading: Mark 6 v 1-6

¹Jesus left there and went to his hometown, accompanied by his disciples.
²When the Sabbath came, he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were amazed.

"Where did this man get these things?" they asked. "What's this wisdom that has been given him, that he even does miracles! ³Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas and Simon? Aren't his sisters here with us?" **And they took offense at him**.


⁴Jesus said to them, "Only in his hometown, among his relatives and in his own house is a prophet without honour." ⁵He could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them. ⁶And he was amazed at their lack of faith.

In this passage the people were amazed - amazed at the preaching of Jesus yes - but also amazed that this level of preaching, these fantastic miracles could be done by someone they knew - someone from their own town and neighbourhood. This can't be possible - he's from round here, his father is the local joiner - he's got brothers and sisters we all grew up with and played with. He's got too big for his boots this one. He should know his place. As Mark puts it - they took offense at him.

But we also read that Jesus was amazed - amazed at their lack of faith. The people had heard preaching they had never heard before; they had seen miracles they had never seen before and yet they took offense. They didn't recognize God in this local man. And so, Jesus could do very little there - apart from a few healings.

Does God work through local people? Does God use the person you know? Does God work in your church and through people in the church? Or is God unable to work because of lack of faith?

Would Jesus be amazed by your lack of faith?
