

We are excited to be seeing the first fruits of the expansion of BMS World Mission's partnership with the Baptist Evangelical Convention of Peru (CEBP) beyond church leadership training, community social projects and environmental action. BMS cooperation with the establishment of CEBP's first mission board, JME, is a big step forward for mission in Peru and beyond.



SUNDAY 29

Please continue to hold BMS workers Dave and Michele Mahon in prayer as they participate in CEBP's mission plans for Peru, and for Daniel Clark as advisor to the JME. May the number of Peruvians engaged in mission multiply.

MONDAY 30

Pray for success as BMS-supported worker Pastor Carlos, and Pastors Manuel and Pepe, implement CEBP's bold plan to start 150 new churches in Peru and overseas. Pray too for the strengthening and expanding of current mission work.

Enjoying God in Prayer – 4.

This week we conclude the series looking at prayer. My thanks to Kieran, the Pastor at Dedridge Baptist Church for allowing me to share this.

5. We enjoy God by responding to his Spirit

This brings us back to prayer as relationship. In prayer, we listen, reflect on the Spirit's leading, and respond to that leading. John tells us: (7v37-39), "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them. By this he meant the Spirit, who those who believed in him were later to receive."

Christian living is letting the Spirit flow from within us. Paul calls it 'not living according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.' And that means responding to he who is with us and lives in us. It is being led by the Spirit, or Eph. 6 'keeping in step with the Spirit.'

John Piper famously said, "God is most glorified in us, when we are most satisfied in him." And I'm saying we can become satisfied with God in prayer by resisting self-awareness; resting in his presence; by meditating on his person; by receiving his love; and responding to his Spirit. And this isn't all about us; it glorifies God.

A Thought from Charlie

"...realise that you Heavenly Father will....give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him." (Luke 11:13. TLB)

Before he left His disciples, Christ promised that He would send the Comforter to help them in the trials, cares, and temptations of life.

This word comforter means: "one that helps alongside". He is the Holy Spirit, the powerful third Person of the Trinity...co-equal with God the Father and God the Son. 
Upgrading facilities.

You may notice over the next 2 or 3 weeks some changes to our AV system in the church. A generous donation is allowing us to upgrade our present system. This will see:

- a new quality sound system and wall speakers which should provide better sound.
- the loop system for the hard of hearing which has been unusable for several years being refurbished with a new loop amplifier.
- the projector and screen being replaced with a large screen monitor at the front of the church and a smaller monitor mounted at the back of the church for the benefit of the leader/speaker.
- a radio mic which will be used on a trial basis this will do away with. the need for a cable running across the front of the church.
- a new computer which will replace the 2 older computers used at present.

The church broadband has been upgraded already to full fibre so these facilities should be sufficient for our needs into the future as we continue to reach out to our community.
