

BMS Prayer Guide 2023

This week we pray for a region geographically small, but large in its impact on world affairs. In previous years BMS World Mission partnered mostly with peace and reconciliation organisations, and their work and impact continues today. Currently, BMS strategically prioritises work with people on the move within the country.



SUNDAY 19

Give thanks for the 12 years of partnership between BMS and the Association of Baptist Churches in Israel. Praise God for new churches planted, churches revitalised, Nazareth Evangelical College, and youth and family ministries.

MONDAY 20

Pray for the Association of Baptist Churches in Israel as the partnership with BMS finishes at the end of this year. Pray that they will be able to employ a full-time Executive Director, that their plans will prosper and that the Association and the churches will be a blessing to the nation.

TUESDAY 21

Pray that those who feel they have no influence on the peace process, but live with the daily consequences of decisions made by others, will know that God hears.

WEDNESDAY 22

BMS partner Bethlehem Bible College (BBC) trains people for ministries throughout the Arab-speaking world. Pray that the college would have the staff and facilities it needs.

THURSDAY 23

BMS contributes towards BBC student scholarships. Pray that those who study would grow both in theological knowledge and personal maturity.

FRIDAY 24

Pray for our partner the Shepherd Society in their humanitarian work in and around Bethlehem and with displaced people in Jordan. Pray that the people they work among would receive Christ's love as well as material aid.

SATURDAY 25

Intercede for all who have a role in contributing to peace in the Holy Land.

Ask that they will be reminded daily to do their part, no matter what others are doing.

The Trouble with Christmas.

It's always good to have a theme running through our worship services during advent and this year the theme will be 'The trouble with Christmas.' Now before you get your pencil sharpened to write in and complain let me tell you where we're going with this...

On the first Sunday in Advent (Dec 3rd) I'll be looking at the birth of John the Baptist where we see Zechariah - gripped with fear, Luke 1:12 'When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear'.



On Dec 10th Archie will consider Mary - greatly troubled. Luke 1:29. 'Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be.'

Then on Dec 17th and 24th, Donna will tackle the shepherdsterrified, Luke 2:9 . 'An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and



the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified' and Herod – disturbed Mat 2:3 'When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him.'

A Thought from Charlie


As I was looking through old history magazines, I came across an article about the time of the Aztecs in South America. It spoke of the great temples and cities that they built, but also of the human sacrifices that they offered. Blood....flowing from human beings, because they thought it would appease 'the gods'. But then also I thought of the Old Testament Tabernacle...and later the Temple, where the blood of animals would be sacrificed according to the Law of God.

But sacrifice is what God asks of us. A living sacrifice. I picture myself on an altar, and as soon as God strikes the match to light the flame of some fiery ordeal, I do what any living sacrifice would do.... Humanly speaking I crawl off the altar in the face of difficulty. This is exactly the dilemma Christians face. First we are to present our bodies, that is, give them in the Lord's service as a free will offering. And because our sacrifice is a living one, it involves choice. The gift of salvation does not require us to become a living sacrifice. We are not forced onto the altar. We are not coerced to stay on the altar. It is a choice that we make out of love for Jesus.

If presenting yourself as a living sacrifice seems downright distasteful, if you find yourself trying to devise a way of serving God that seems more agreeable to your comforts, remember this: Jesus sacrificed everything for you. Please do not argue with the Lord about how heavily He stokes the fire of your trial. Just get back on the altar.... It's your spiritual worship.

Last Christmas the family gave us a gift voucher to use at Kinloch Lodge — 'Lady Claire's" — and it had to be used by this Christmas so we decided to head off to the said Kinloch Lodge for a nice lunch on Wednesday. The boys were all at school so, not wanting to leave Kirsten alone, the three of us went.
