

Think you know it all? 49.

I've reached the end of the book so this is the last 'Think you know it all?'!

What are the nautical terms for:

- The front of a vessel BOW
- A unit of speed equal to one nautical mile per hour KNOT
- A unit of length usually equaivalent to three nautical miles LEAGUE
- The left hand side of a vessel when facing forward PORT
- The right hand side of a vessel when facing forward STARBOAED

- A measurement (principally of depth) equivalent to six feet FATHOM
- A line to show where the level of water should reach when a ship is properly and fully loaded – PLIMSOLL LINE

BMS Prayer Guide 2024

Help for the journey is what BMS World Mission desires to offer people in our world who are forcibly displaced: refugees, asylum seekers and others who have had to flee from imminent danger. It is also what God offers to us in our journey of faith. We therefore pray for hope in our journey and hope for all journeys.



SUNDAY 21

Pray that no matter where an asylum seeker is on their journey, God's people will welcome and walk with them. Pray too that we can all be 'welcome' and 'home'" for each other on our journeys.

MONDAY 22

Pray that people who have had to flee from home because of danger will find strength for their journey. Pray for God's strength for us in our journey in this new year.

TUESDAY 23

Pray for forcibly displaced people who get stuck in refugee camps and similar settings, sometimes for years or decades. Lift up those in your life – including yourself if appropriate – who feel stuck in their journey of faith.

WEDNESDAY 24

Pray that forcibly displaced people will receive physical, spiritual, emotional and social care to sustain them on their journey. Pray that we too may receive and give this care (Matthew 6: 11).

THURSDAY 25

Pray that asylum seekers will receive help from those they meet on their journey: governments, churches and individuals. Pray that we will offer and receive help on our journeys.

FRIDAY 26

Pray for protection for asylum seekers from those who would harm them, and for the ability to trust those who will help. Pray

for discernment for them and for us.

SATURDAY 27

Pray that forcibly displaced people will experience God's love, guidance and presence on their journey, and will know deep hope as a result. Pray this also for yourself and your community.

Who do you worship?

Henry Ward Beecher, the famous pulpit orator, once had to be absent and his brother was invited to speak for him. The church house was crowded, but when it became evident that the eloquent Henry Beecher was not going to appear, many started to leave. Beecher's brother was not disturbed. He stood up before the murmuring crowd, called for silence and said, "All who came this morning to worship Henry W. Beecher may now leave. The rest will remain and worship God."

What are we doing in our assemblies? Some, like the Athenians, come only to hear the preacher say something (Acts 17:20-21). Is it relevant? Is it positive? Are mental guidelines used in judging sermons? Some attend to judge the singing, the prayers, or the friendliness of the congregation. These go away with a host of criticisms.

Why do we gather for worship? Some are here to get it over with for a week; to get their tickets validated once more. But those who are here because they need strength in carrying their crosses know the value of worship. Worship has nothing to do with the song leader or the talent of the preacher. It has to do with you and your God.

'How to Survive Almost Anything'


I think it was last birthday when this post-it note graced a book Fiona gave me for my birthday. The book, 'How to Survive Almost Anything', was written by a former UK Special Forces soldier Ollie Ollerton (don't think he is

At first look I wasn't sure how I could use it and put it aside to come back to when I had finished the 'Think You Know it All' series. Well that time has now come so here goes.....does anyone really need to know how to kill someone with a paper clip? (Just kidding! – nothing as useful in the book!)

The book is sub-titled 'The Special Forces Guide to Staying Alive' but I suppose it could equally well have been 'The Special Forces' Bible' so using that slightly tenuous link let's see what we can learn......

The 'Contents' page lists three sections before you really get into the meat of the book.....

- A note from the author
- Introduction
- How to use this book


Let's just look at the 'Note from the author' this week to see if we can learn anything from 'this bible' which may help us as we compare it to 'The Bible'. In this half page the author introduces himself (My name is Ollie Ollerton) and explains his experiences (I am a survivor, a former UK Special Forces soldier...51 years of experience on this planet.) and attributes (I have been trained to fight and survive I every

known theatre of operations..) which qualify him to write the book and why we should take heed of it. He goes on to say he is 'self-aware', that he has 'the knowledge and experience to handle any given situation' and that he wants to share that knowledge and his reason for wanting to share it ...' The last thing anyone wants to die of is ignorance..'

Not much different from 'The Bible' then – in the first verse the author introduces himself – God; gives his qualifications – Creator and length of experience – In the beginning; And the purpose of the book to bring light into a dark world.....more next week.
