

## A Thought from Charlie

"I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, and His incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of His mighty strength, which He exerted in Christ when He raised Him from the dead." (Ephesians 1:18-20)

God has incomparable great power in store for those who believe, The same power He exerted when He raised Christ from the dead. In other words, the sky is the limit when it comes to the display of God's mighty strength in your life.

The usual word for God's power in the Greek New Testament is the word **Dunamis**, from which we get our word dynamite. But, we also get the word Dynamo from Dunamis. A Dynamo is just as strong as dynamite, and maybe more so. But the power of a Dynamo isn't obvious. Its power is quiet, controlled, and steady, and not like the explosive bang you get from sticks of dynamite. This is the kind of inward power that is displayed by God in the lives of saintly Christians.

It takes God's power to be a faithful spouse, a conscientious parent, or a responsible office worker. If you are struggling, remember that His power is for you and it is incomparably great. If the Father could raise His Son from the dead, he can raise you above your circumstances.

Think about that today!

## 'How to Survive Almost Anything 4.' (continued from last week)

We're looking at the three-part introduction to 'How to survive almost anything.' And have reached the third part 'How to use this book.' The writer says that 'This book is easily navigable as it's split into easy-to-access sections...

The Bible is a much larger volume than this book and navigating it a bit more difficult. But to help us, it is split into sections – two larger sections – The Old Testament and The New Testament and these two main sections divided into smaller sections - 39 in the OT and 27 in the NT. These 'books' are further split into chapters and verses. These divisions all make it easier to access the Bible but how do we **use** the Bible? Here is one church's idea...

- When things look "blue," read Isaiah, chapter 40
- When tempted to do wrong, read Psalm 139.
- If you are facing a crisis, read Psalm 46.
- When you are discouraged, think over Psalm 23.
- If you are "bored," read Psalms 103 and 104, or Job, chapters 38-40.
- When you are lonely or fearful, read over Psalm 27.
- When you are anxious for dear ones, read Psalm 107.
- When you plan your budget, read St. Luke's Gospel, chapter 19.
- If you are sick or in pain, read Psalm 91.
- When you are very weary, seek St. Matthew 11:28-30, Romans 8:31-39.
- When everything seems to be going from bad to worse, try II Timothy 3.
- The best investment is described in St. Matthew's Gospel, chapter 6.
- When your friends seem to go back on you, hold fast to I Corinthians 13.
- For an inward peace, consider the 14th chapter of St. John's Gospel.
- Have you been placed in a position of great responsibility? Read Joshua, chapter 1.
- If you have been bereaved, there is a message for you in I Corinthians 15, and Revelation 21.
- If you have experienced severe losses, read the last paragraphs of chapter 8 of Romans.
- When you have sinned, read I John 1, St. John 3:1-22, Isaiah 53, and make Psalm 51 your prayer.
- If you have a fear of death, read St. John's Gospel, chapters 11, 17, and
   20; Il Corinthians, chapters 4, 5; Romans, chapter 8; Revelation, chapters
   7, 21, and 22


