

A Thought from Charlie

"Now, the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." (2 Corinthians 3:17)

Jesus never said to his disciples: "obey my rules". Instead, he told his followers to: "Obey Me!" And because the Lord did not leave us with a long list of 'thou shall not...", we have freedom.

Jesus stripped the fear and intimidation we often feel from obedience when he wrapped his life around his Word. What liberty! The Lord made obedience something that you would desire to do because he gave his life that you might be free. What a brilliant motivation for us to trust and obey.

Sometimes I wish that God would give me less freedom and force me to do the right thing to make me obey. It would be easier that way. This "Freedom stuff", carries with it the heavy weight of responsibility. I am required to decide between white and black, light, dark, good and evil. I am reminded to make choices. I am required to be free.

But that's the beauty of knowing the freedom of the Lord. And it is his love that makes me want to be free.

This is why Jesus said his commandments were not burdensome. Obeying God was never meant to be a chore or a duty, but a joyous response to His love.

Do you know this joy today...even in the midst trials and difficulties?

We are not talking a frothy laughter here...but the deep seated joy found only when we are walking obediently before the LORD.

'How to Survive Almost Anything 5.' (continued from last week)

Well, this week we move past the three-part introduction to this book, onto Part 1, 'The Survivor's Mindset'.

The part starts with general comments on 'What makes a survivor?' and in one paragraph the writer says that 'Survival is rarely an accident.' He then goes on to give examples from his own experience and that of others to back this up.

If we move our thinking from the physical realm into the spiritual the same holds good. Becoming a Christian is rarely never an accident. No one is born 'Christian'. No one can have a 'back to the

future' experience and re-emerge as a Christian. Becoming a Christian is deliberate. No one can wander into it. It can happen in many ways but never accidently. It can happen suddenly, it can take years, but never accidently.

Paul the New Testament terror of the early church became a follower of Jesus through a sudden, mind-blowing encounter with God while on his way to round up Christians. For others it can be a long process of gradual realisation and understanding of God's love and Jesus' sacrifice for 'me'.

Want to know if you're a Christian? - the writer of the book of Romans in the New Testament put it this way — 'If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.'

And that doesn't happen by accident.


