

'How to Survive Almost Anything 12.'

We're on to Part 2 of the book headed 'Essentials' and this week it's about 'Thinking Ahead'. The author suggests that 'You wouldn't climb into a boxing ring with an opponent you knew nothing about; you'd do a bit of research on them and their style' and 'To have the best chance of survival you need to go equipped with knowledge.'

I don't suppose any of us would disagree with these sentiments – mind you I don't suppose many of us have gone into a boxing ring.

But the Bible teaches us that, as Christians, we are in a battle whether we like it or not. In Ephesians 6 Paul puts it like this, '12 For our struggle is not

against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms'

Now that sounds scary, and it is and if we go into this fight unprepared we are in for a rough time. But fortunately, Paul goes on to explain that we are not defenceless – check out verses 13-19 of Ephesians 6. Think ahead, being equipped with the knowledge we need will give us the best chance of survival in this 'war.'

Lord, thou knowest better than I know myself that I am growing older and will some day be old.

Keep me from the fatal habit of thinking I must say something on every subject and on every occasion.

Release me from craving to straighten out everybody's affairs. Make me thoughtful but not moody; helpful but not bossy.

With my vast store of wisdom it seems a pity not to use it all, but Thou knowest Lord, that I want a few friends at the end.

Keep my mind free from the recital of endless details; give me wings to get to the point. Seal my lips on my aches and pains. They are increasing and love of rehearsing them is becoming sweeter as the years go by.

I dare not ask for grace enough to enjoy the tales of others' pains, but help me to endure them with patience.

I dare not ask for improved memory, but for a growing humility and a lessening cocksureness when my memory seems to clash with the memories of others. Teach me the glorious lesson that occasionally I may be mistaken.

Keep me reasonably sweet; I do not want to be a saint – some of them are so hard to live with – but a sour old person is one of the crowning works of the Devil.

Give me the ability to see good things in unexpected places and talents in unexpected people.

And, give me, O Lord, the grace to tell them so. Amen













