'How to Survive Almost Anything 13.'

We're on to Part 2 of the book headed 'Essentials' and last time we thought about 'Thinking Ahead'. Today we're looking at one of the four pillars of wilderness survival — 'Shelter'. The author allocates 10 pages to types of shelter and where to build it and the first point he makes is that we should use what is naturally available. We all need shelter whether it's a warm cosy house for more permanent shelter, an arbour in the garden for sunny days or a large rock to hide behind when out walking the hills and wind is getting up. Physical shelter is necessary for survival physically. But

equally well we need spiritual shelter. Life, even for the Christian, is not always sunny and cosy. Sometimes it can get rough and we need to have a place where we can go to avoid suffering from spiritual exposure (not sure there is such a thing but you get the drift!). Somewhere we can regroup, pull ourselves together, remember who we are and get ready for the next leg of the journey. Check out Psalm 46 or 91!!

'Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.' Psalm 91:1

After making a whopping \$50 million donation to a gun control initiative, and because of his work against obesity and smoking, former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg was quoted as saying: "I am telling you, if there is a God, when I get to heaven I'm not stopping to be interviewed. I am heading straight in...I have earned my place in heaven. It's not even close."

How does that sound to you? Presumptuous? Arrogant? The very idea that Mr. Bloomberg could think he could "buy" his way into heaven must be offensive to God. How less offensive is it when we believe and act like we can earn our way into heaven by:

- Going to church three times a week.
- Reading our Bibles daily.
- Giving generously each first day of the week.
- Helping the poor.
- Being a good father/ mother/husband/wife/son/daughter.

The above list could go on and on. Do we, along with Mr. Bloomberg need to be reminded that after all we could possibly do, we are still unprofitable servants (Luke 17:10)? Do we also need to be reminded that our righteousness, the best we can offer, is as filthy rags to God (Isaiah 64:6)?


You see, heaven isn't a matter of attainment, it's a matter of atonement. If we're in heaven someday, it won't be because we earned it. It won't be because we wowed God with our own morality and righteousness. And it won't be because God's indebted to us. On the contrary, it will be because we're indebted to him!
