'How to Survive Almost Anything 14.'

We're still on Part 2 of the book headed 'Essentials' and last time we thought about one of the four pillars of wilderness survival – 'Shelter'. This week we move on to the second pillar - 'Warmth'. In our climate I don't think any of us would dispute that we need warmth to survive. Sitting comfortably in our centrally heated houses it doesn't take a lot of imagination to envisage how life would be outside in bad weather, cold weather with no way of keeping warm. Even in this country every year people die from exposure, caught out in the elements without the correct gear. Warmth is certainly essential for survival and one of the best ways to provide that warmth is by physical contact.


In our life as Christians we need warmth. It's easy to grow cold and lose the fire that once kept us going. We can generate the warmth we need by keeping busy serving God and others but possibly the best way is to maintain the physical contact with other Christians by being an active member of an active Christian fellowship Some would say that you can be a Christian without being a member of a church and that is true - being a church member, or attending a fellowship does not of itself make you a Christian. But it is very difficult to keep the warmth if you do not have regular contact with other Christians who are there to encourage you when you're low, get you back on the straight and narrow when you've strayed, people who can laugh with you and cry with you, people who are there for you, and who pray for you and with you.

I spoke to someone recently who has been a Christian for a long time but who had experienced one of those church disagreements which remind us that the church is not full of perfect people but people struggling, with God's help, to be nearer what we should be. As a result, she was telling me of almost 5 years with no regular church attendance, no church family to be there for her and keep her warm. You could see it in her face and hear it in her voice. I encouraged her to get back to what she had known for so many years – not necessarily her former fellowship but another where she could get to know folk and get the close contact, we all need.

Where do you get your warmth just now? Do you meet regularly with other Christians, or have you got out of the habit? Do something about it before it's too late – that is if you want to survive!
